

Eschatology in Acts

Acts 1:1-8 – The kingdom

Acts 1:9-11 – Jesus' return

Acts 3:11-26 – God will send a time of refreshing and restoration of Israel when Jesus, the Messiah, returns.

Acts 13:26-50 – Paul explains the Gospel to the Jews who reject it, but promises to turn to the Gentiles

Acts 14:22 – “We must go through many hardships to enter the kingdom of God.”

Acts 15:12-21 – James explains from Dt. 14:2, 2 Kings 24:15-25:7 and, mainly in the text, Amos 9:11-12 that before Israel is restored God is going to gather people from among the Gentiles. Then, God will rebuild David's throne and restore the nation of Israel.

Acts 17:26-34 – God has appointed the man that he has raised from the dead to judge all men and raise them from the dead

Acts 20:28-32 – savage wolves will arise in the church from among their own numbers to take captive people

Acts 22:21 – Paul tells the Jewish crowd on the Temple Mount that the Lord told him, “Go; I will send you far away to the Gentiles.”

Acts 23:6-7 – Paul makes his case before the Sanhedrin on his position in belief in the resurrection of the dead.

Acts 24:14-16 – Paul has the same hope in God as his Jewish accusers, that there is a resurrection.

Acts 26:4-8 – The hope in God's promise to the twelve tribes of the resurrection of the dead.

Acts 28:17-31 – Jews hear, but many fulfill prophecy of never understanding, but salvation goes to the Gentiles who will listen and understand.
