### **Hebrews 11:17-22**

11:17 – "By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of offering up his only son,



- 1. Some attempt to teach this event was a difficult test for Abraham because he had to choose between his love for God and his love for his son. Or, a test of obedience to God vs. love for his son.
- 2. This issue, or the test, seems to be how Abraham reconciles the several promises (or, revelations) of God with each other.
  - a. Notice "received the promises" is plural
  - b. 11:18 specifically identifies one of the promises: "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." But, now God is revealing that Isaac is to be offered as a sacrifice.
  - c. So, the conflict is between the promise and the revelation:
    - i. The promise: "through Isaac shall your offspring be."
    - ii. The revelation: "Take your son...to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you."
  - d. This conflict is impossible to resolve or understand accept by faith, or trusting in the Lord is able to do both.
  - e. By faith, not by understanding, Abraham accepted in obedience.
- 3. "only begotten son" is *monogene* which does NOT mean "only son" (Abraham had another son, and eventually had many sons). *Monogene* contains the idea of "unique" son. This is the son with the promise. The other sons did not and will not have the same promise.
- 4. "having received" anadechomai
  - a. Used in Acts 28:7
    - i. NIV "There was an estate nearby that belonged to Publius, the chief official of the island. He <u>welcomed</u> (anadexamenos) us to his home and showed us generous hospitality for three days."
    - ii. ESV "Now in the neighborhood of that place were lands belonging to the chief man of the island, named Publius, who <u>received</u> (anadexamenos) us and entertained us hospitably for three days."
  - b. Often used in the papyri in a legal sense to say "undertake," "assume"
  - c. Abraham had "assumed" responsibility for the promise and had "undertaken" seeing the promise come to pass. Thus, Abraham's faith was actively working with the promise.

i. It would have been contrary to Abraham's faith to eliminate the promised seed, but because of his faith in God's command Abraham was willing to use his faith to do things that seemed to conflict with his faith.

- 1. This verse tells us how Abraham could use his faith to obey the command which was coming against his faith in the promise of the seed. Abraham had faith in God and "considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead."
- 2. "Considered" logisamenos "to reckon", "to consider"
  - a. It means to "compute"; "to take into account"; "to reckon"; "to reason to a logical conclusion"
  - b. Logizomai is the root for English "logic" and "logical"
