- 1. "Remember" is a call to the believers to recall the teaching of the apostles or the Word of God.
 - a. This is the <u>first imperative</u> of this letter, or first command, demand on the people.
 - b. This begins a series of imperatives in verses 17-23:
 - c. Forgetting (or, not knowing) the Scripture results in spiritual regression
 - d. Not knowing the Word of God will prevent these believers from applying: faith, prayer, love of God and mercy commanded in verse 20 (imperatives).
 - e. The first section of Jude began with the same when he wrote in verse 5: "Now I want to <u>remind</u> you, although you once fully knew it..."





Jude 19 – It is these who cause divisions, worldly people, devoid of the Spirit.

1. Described as:

- a. "worldly people" psychikoi "worldly-minded"
- b. "devoid of the spirit"
 - i. "The Spirit" would be the Holy Spirit
 - 1. This is true, but may not be the context of this statement
 - ii. "spirit" would be the human spirit
 - 1. This may be the context of this statement here.
 - 2. This would be the "hardened heart" (or "hardened human spirit"
 - 3. This spirit would be dead and unresponsive to:
 - a. Truth
 - b. Light
 - c. Holy Spirit
 - d. Instinctive human nature such as referred to in Romans 1:18-32
 - i. 1:18 they "suppress the truth"
 - ii. 1:19 "what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them"
 - iii. 1:21 "they knew God, they did not honor him as God."
 - iv. 1:21 "they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened."

- v. 1:24 "God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts (spirits" to impurity"
- vi. 1:25 "they exchanged the truth about God for a lie"
- vii. 1:26 "God gave them up to dishonorable passions"
- viii. 1:26 They "exchanged natural relations for those that are contrary to nature."
- ix. 1:28 "God gave them up to a debased mind to do what ought not to be done."
- e. Worse than brute beasts and animals who maintain their natural, nurturing instincts

Jude 20 – But you, beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit,



- 1. These next four verses are the main point of the letter.
- 2. The "You", "Beloved", and "Yourselves" are all plural. So, the context is not necessarily directions on how "you, the individual" builds yourself up, but how the body (community, church) of believers builds themselves up to defend against the heretics.
- 3. The following compressed instruction will:
 - a. Preserve the faith of the beloved
 - b. Guide the beloved in an empowering respond to those who are failing in faith
- 4. Four imperatives in regard to the beloved's:
 - a. Faith
 - b. Hope
 - c. Love
 - d. Prayer
- 5. Jude opens the book with this statement in 1:3 -

"I found it necessary to write appealing to you to <u>contend for the faith</u> that was once for all delivered to the saints."

and, now writes seventeen verses later to use the "faith...delivered to the saints" to "build yourselves up" in 1:20 -

"you, beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith."

- a. "the faith" is the body of Truth we know as the Word of God or Sound Doctrine.
- b. "the faith" is Truth that we know, believe and are stabilized on
- c. "the faith" is the Rock as in the Words Jesus spoke:
 "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock." Matthew 7:24

- i. Notice:
 - 1. The Rock is the Words of Jesus, or what Jude calls "the Faith"
 - 2. The wise man "built his house" on the Rock, so he was building on or continuing the building of the structure (his life) by continuing in the Word, the Truth, the Faith.
- 6. Four imperatives for the beloved to do to overcome the effect of false teaching:
 - a. "Building up yourselves in your most holy faith"
 - i. "Building Up" is *epoikodomeo* meaning "to build upon, build up" and refers to finishing the structure whose foundation has already been laid"
 - 1. Just like a house is built on the foundation.
 - 2. This refers to constant progress towards finishing the house.
 - 3. This is not referring to laying the foundation, but is understood to be the ongoing building process being done on the already finished foundation.
 - ii. Faith is confidence or belief in something such as information or a person
 - iii. "Most holy faith" would refer to confidence or belief in the:
 - 1. "Most Holy" is *hagios* means "sacred, holy" and is used to say "set apart for God".
 - a. This is totally different and entirely set apart from other things such as religious, philosophies, cultures.
 - b. This refers to confidence or belief in something that is from God and set apart by God
 - c. This is not the faith of the believer, but the faith of true Christian doctrine.
 - 2. "Most Holy" information
 - a. The most holy information is the Word of God
 - b. The Word of God is revelation from God through the Holy Spirit
 - c. This is not merely a person's opinion, a philosophy, another person's promise, etc.
 - d. This is the unchangeable Word of God, the Word that spoke creation into existence.
 - 3. "Most Holy" person
 - a. This is the person of Jesus Christ
 - b. This is God himself
 - iv. Build yourself up by understanding the revelation given to you by God through:
 - 1. Understand God's Word (Apostles, Prophets) recorded as Scripture
 - a. Old Testament
 - b. New Testament
 - 2. Understand God's Son
 - v. The Most Holy revelation will build up your Most Holy Faith (confidence, belief, empowerment, etc.)
 - vi. Read and study Scripture:
 - 1. Acts 2:42 "They devoted themselves to the <u>apostles' teaching</u> and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."
 - 2. Acts 20:32 "Now <u>I commend you to God and to the word of his grace</u>, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified."

- 3. 2 Timothy 2:15 "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth."
- 4. Hebrews 5:12,14 "you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of the oracles of God. You need milk, not solid food ...solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil."
- b. "Praying in the Holy Spirit"
 - i. Again, the focus is on how the beloved can overcome the false teachers and their false teaching.
 - ii. By "praying in the Holy Spirit" the believer is praying from a position in the Faith, on the Rock, in the Truth.
 - iii. 2 Corinthians 10:3-5 "For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh.
 For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ."
 - iv. What does it mean to "pray in the Holy Spirit"
 - 1. It follows the command that involves understanding and having faith in the revelation of God (the Word, Scripture, Jesus Christ.)
 - 2. It would mean in this fellowship with God (through the Holy Spirit) pray:
 - 3. The Holy Spirit is in the believer empowered to actively follow the Holy Spirit through understanding the revelation from God:
 - a. Romans 8:9-11; 13-15 —
 "You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the
 Spirit of God dwells in you...If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus
 from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the
 dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who
 dwells in you...For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but
 if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.
 For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you
 did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you
 have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry,
 "Abba! Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that
 we are children of God."
 - b. Galatians 5:16-18; 22-25 -
 - "Walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law...But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit."

- c. Here in Jude the man who in Romans and Galatians
 - -has the Holy Spirit dwelling in them,
 - -is walking by the Spirit as they conduct their life,
 - -is <u>led</u> by the Spirit in moral and ethical choices,
 - -is producing fruit of the Spirit in their character,
 - -is living by the Spirit,
 - -is putting to death the misdeeds of the body by the Spirit
 - -is keeping in step with the Spirit,
 - then that person is likely able to pray in the Holy Spirit!
- 4. Does praying in the Holy Sprit mean to pray in tongues? Well, do you walk in tongues, produce fruit of tongues, live in tongues, keep in step with tongues? If you are indwelt by the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit is leading you in conduct, choices, character while you live and remain in step (fellowship) with God the Holy Spirit, then you can pray in the Holy Spirit without praying in tongues.
- c. "Keep yourselves in the love of God"
 - i. "Keep" is tereo meaning "to attend to carefully, take care of, to guard."
 - 1. This is attentive and watchful care of a thing you currently possess.
 - 2. Pay careful attention not to leave the circle or sphere of God's love.
 - ii. Remain in the sphere of God's love
 - iii. God's love for us is in Christ, in Christ atoning death, in fellowship with the light as he is in the light...we remain here.
 - 1. God's love is to Christ.
 - 2. Christ's live is to us.
 - 3. We remain in that love.
 - a. Love Christ. Love God.
 - b. Obey...grow...imitate...produce fruit...
 - c. Walk in the light as Jesus is in the light
 - d. Maintain fellowship with Christ
 - iv. To leave the realm of "the love of God" would mean to follow false teaching into a realm that is opposite of the realm of God's love:
 - 1. To leave the atoning death of Christ and replace it with human works.
 - 2. To leave the light would mean to leave the character of God's nature
 - v. It is possible to turn your back on the love of God.
 - 1. This **does not** mean lose salvation.
 - a. It could indicate salvation was never received
 - 2. This does mean progress, growth, fellowship has stopped.
 - a. Understanding of the Truth (Light, Word) has stopped because it has been replaced with false teaching
 - b. The person is no longer built up in the Most Holy Faith or Praying (living, walking) in the Holy Spirit because they are outside the sphere where God's love abides which is in Christ.
 - vi. John 15:9-10
 - "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you.

Abide in my love.

If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love."

vii. 1 John 6-8 -

"If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.

But <u>if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another</u>, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

- d. Waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life."
 - i. We need mercy for salvation, for sanctification and for glorification.
 - ii. The "mercy" we are waiting for is opposite the judgment the heretics are waiting for.
- 7. False teaching today:
 - a. Belief is doubted
 - b. Do culturally accepted good
 - c. Love is emotional
 - d. Hope forgotten
 - e. Christianity can become a mere temporal philosophical ideology empowered by sentimental and self-willed energy to advance a worldly agenda.
- 8. False teaching and false application of the heretics in Jude:
 - a. Crept in unnoticed
 - b. Ungodly
 - c. Pervert the grace into sensuality
 - d. Deny Jesus Christ as Master and Lord
 - e. They have been delivered, but did not believe
 - f. They left their proper place of authority
 - g. Indulged in sexual immorality
 - h. Pursued unnatural desire
 - i. Rely on their dreams (visions, not Word of Truth)
 - j. Defile the flesh (natural man)
 - k. Reject authority in the natural world
 - I. Blaspheme spiritual things
 - m. They do not stay in the place of the Lord's authority
 - n. They are spiritless humans more depraved than an animal
 - o. They kill those who are following God and his decrees
 - p. They use Christianity for profit
 - q. They rebel against what God has set up
 - r. They do not realize the danger they are in or the judgement they will face
 - s. They are leaders who only concern is their own advancement and pleasure
 - t. They cannot provide for the people of God
 - u. They find direction from culture, not the eternal plan of God
 - v. They are fruitless
 - w. They are dead and unable to recover because they are uprooted
 - x. Their very lives expose the filth and garbage they have in their souls.
 - y. They have no direction and are heading into darkness

- z. They grumble and are unsatisfied
- aa. They are lead by their sinful desires.
- bb. They boast about themselves
- cc. They only show favor to others in order to gain an advantage over them or the situation.

Jude 21 – keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life.



Jude 22 – And have mercy on those who doubt;



Jude 23 – save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show mercy with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh.



Jude 24 – Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy,
