- 1. Four Stories and Four Decisions Mark 4:35-6:6
 - a. Storm Faith or Fear (4:35-41)
 - b. Gerasene demoniac Acceptance or Rejection (5:1-20)
 - c. Jairus and Woman Faith or espair (5:21-43)
 - d. Hometown Nazareth Belief or Disbelief (6:1-6)
- 2. The disciples are on the inside, but they must continually ask and learn: "Who is this?"
 - a. The disciples believe, but they do not know.
 - b. The disciples have faith, but are afraid of what they do not yet understand.
- 3. This account has many first hand details that are less vivid in Matt. 8:23-27 and Luke 8:22-25
 - a. Hour of the day
 - b. The disciples took Jesus from the boat he was teaching in
 - c. Presence of other boats
 - d. The boat taking on water
 - e. Jesus sleeping on a cushion
 - f. Disciples' sarcasm
 - g. Jesus' rebuke
- 4. Matches OT accounts of God stopping storms:
 - a. Jonah 1
 - b. Psalm 107:23-32
- 5. The "Jesus Boat"
 - a. Found during a drought off coast of Sea of Galillee five miles south of Capernaum
 - b. 26.5 feet long, 7.5 feet wide, 4.5 feet high
 - c. Matches design of first-century mosaic of a Galilean boat one mile from where the "Jesus Boat" was found at Migdal
 - d. Also, a 500's AD mosaic at Madeba
 - e. Carbon 14 dates it to 120 BC-40 AD
 - f. Propelled by four rowers, two on each side
 - g. Full capacity of 15 people
 - h. This boat matches the details of the boat in this story
- 6. Sea of Galilee is:
 - a. 700 feet below sea level
 - b. Surrounded by hills and mountains
 - c. Mt. Hermon is 30 miles NE at the height of 9,200 feet above sea level
 - d. Interchange of cold upper air from Mt. Hermon and warm air rising from the encircled Sea of Galilee produces weather conditions called "



- 1. "a storm violent of wind" lailaps megale anemou
 - a. Lailaps means "a hurricane" and is used to say "a sudden storm, squall, whirlwind, hurricane"
 - b. Megale is megas meaning "great"
 - c. Anemou is "wind"

4:38 – "But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"



- 1. "stern" is the back of the boat
 - a. Jonah was sleeping and the captain woke him up
- 2. "melei" refers to concern or the object of concern. The disciples ask are we of no concern??
- 3. Apollymetha means "to destroy, destroy utterly

4:39 – "And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace! Be still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.
