ASSYRIA to the North


2:13 – “And he will stretch out his hand against the north
and destroy Assyria,
and he will make Nineveh a desolation,
a dry waste like the desert.

1. Nineveh and the Assyrian Empire had oppressed Israel since the days of King Ahaz (736-715 BC).
 - a. Isaiah 7-8 around 732 BC
 - b. Rezin ruled in Syria 754-732 BC and Pekah ruled in Norther Israel 740-732.
 - c. Ahaz goes to Tiglath-pileser III for help against Rezin and Pekah. Ahaz then met Tiglath-pileser III in Damascus after the Syrian city had fallen to the Assyrians according to 2 Kings 16:9-10:
“The king of Assyria complied by attacking Damascus and capturing it. He deported its inhabitants to Kir and put Rezin to death. Then King Ahaz went to Damascus to meet Tiglath-Pileser king of Assyria. He saw an altar in Damascus and sent to Uriah the priest a sketch of the altar, with detailed plans for its construction.”
 - d. Since 732 BC Assyria was Judah’s protector and claimed suzerainty /suz-era-enty/ over the kingdom
 - e. 731 Assyria set up a king in Northern Israel: Hoshea
 - f. In 722 BC Assyria destroys and deports Northern Israel
 - g. In 701 BC Sennacherib invades Judah, destroys all the fortified cities and threatens Jerusalem
2. Nineveh, the last nation mentioned, was the strongest empire at the time of Zephaniah
3. Nineveh falls 5 years later in 612 BC (or, 5-9 years later after Zephaniah made this prophecy)

5. "Dry waste like a desert"
- Nineveh had a great canal system with the Khoser River running through it and sat alongside the Tigris River.
 - By 401 BC Xenophon records as he traveled past Nineveh that it had become desert sand, because by the time the Greeks marched through the Middle East to take the Persian Empire the city of Nineveh could no longer be identified and the culture was itself ancient history. He did not find a trace of the city since it was buried in sand.



2:14 – "Herds shall lie down in her midst,

1. The great, advanced, sophisticated city would be a place where herds would graze and rest.
 - a. Herds
 - b. Beasts
 - c. The order of creation has been reversed. Instead of man ruling the beasts, the beasts inhabit the remains of the city of man. And, do not appear to be challenged or threatened with expulsion.
2. The great buildings and paneled palaces would become a place for wild animals to find shelter.
 - a. Owl (pelican?) and hedgehog (or, porcupine) lodge on capitals
 - b. Owls hooting from the window ledges
3. Threshold devastated
4. The wooden paneling that covered the stone or brick walls deteriorated exposing the stone/brick blocks.

2:15 – “This is the exultant city
 that lived securely,
 that said in her heart,
 “I am, and there is no one else.”
 What a desolation she has become,
 a lair for wild beasts!
 Everyone who passes by her
 hisses and shakes his fist.

1. A city celebrating and secure in Zephaniah's day would fail
 - a. "exultant" – *haallizah* – means "jubilant" and "triumphantly happy"
 - b. "lived securely" deep in Assyrian territory surrounded by walls and canals for moats
2. After judgment:
 - a. "desolation" – *lesammah* – "waste", "a horror"
 - b. "lair for wild beasts"
 - i. A place for beasts to lay down and rest
 - c. People who pass by scorn the remains and show contempt:
 - i. "hisses"
 - ii. "shakes fist" – as in "away with her" she deserves her fate
 1. Nahum 3:19, another hand gesture at Nineveh's fate:
"All who hear the news about you clap their hands over you.
For upon whom has not come your unceasing evil?"
3. "I am, and there is no one else."
 - a. Self-sufficient
 - i. Same claim as:
 1. Babylon in Isaiah 47:8
 2. Laodicea in Revelation 3:17
 - b. All other nations and cities depend on Nineveh: protection, economy, culture, etc.
